Technisource Welcomes Back Hero

Phoenix Branch Manager Returns from Afghanistan Highly-Decorated

PHOENIX - (September 1, 2006) - Technisource, a national information technology and engineering services provider, has welcomed home Major Alan McKewan, its Phoenix branch manager, who has been serving with the U.S. Army in Afghanistan. He has been the Phoenix branch manager for Technisource since 2004.

McKewan served with the 492nd Civil Affair Battalion, a reserve unit from Phoenix, in the Kandahar region of Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. While working to restore peace and rebuild the infrastructure of this region, his battalion frequently found themselves under hostile fire. His noble actions resulting from this duress earned notable recognition. He earned the Bronze Star Medal, the Army Commendation Medal with Valor for gallantry in action, and the Afghanistan Campaign Medal for his service and dedication to the country. This was his third tour of duty in support of the global war on terrorism.

"We are extremely proud of Alan's military and humanitarian service and grateful that he has returned home safely," said Stephen R. Bova, chairman and CEO of Technisource. McKewan received his commendations by displaying exemplary heroism while under fire and putting himself in harms way to support his fellow soldiers. As a Task Force Project Officer, he directed \$3 million worth of Commander's Emergency Response Program project funding on 28 separate developments that encompassed 62 job sites throughout Kandahar. The projects primarily consisted of infrastructure development ranging from road and bridge building to water well drilling. He also coordinated and conducted 13 village medical outreach operations, treating more than 500 patients in Kandahar.

McKewan also worked on his own time with individual contributors and non-profit organizations to provide winter clothing and school supplies for 1,500 Afghan children

McKewan is currently pursuing his master's of business administration degree in technology management at the University of Phoenix in Scottsdale, Ariz. He holds a bachelor's degree in business administration from Duquesne University in Pittsburgh.
